If you're visiting on a weekend or public holiday we invite you to take a closer look at Warragamba Dam and Lake Burragorang by walking down to the dam wall and lower viewing areas.

10am - 4pm (last entry at 3:45pm)

#### WHEN VISITING THE DAM AND LOWER VIEWING AREAS YOU SHOULD:

- · Be aware that the walk is exposed and steep in parts
- Wear sunscreen and a hat there is not much shade on the dam
- Wear shoes suitable for walking
- Bring a water bottle there are bubblers and bottle refill stations along the way
- Beware of snakes and other wildlife that might be around
- Mind your step and be aware of uneven surfaces -Warragamba Dam is an operational site

#### **MOBILITY BUS**

A free, wheelchair accessible shuttle bus is provided once a month. Please check for upcoming dates on our website.

#### WHY CAN'T I GO DOWN TO THE DAM ON WEEKDAYS?

Warragamba Dam is a working dam. During the week staff carry out maintenance, monitoring and other operations. It is not safe for members of the public to access the dam during these times.


# **Visitor Code**

# Restrictions

- No pets allowed
- 🖎 No wood, charcoal or solid fuel barbeques. Portable gas barbeques are permitted except during total fire bans
- Do not ride bicycles, skateboards or rollerblades on the dam wall, visitor centre stairs, ramp or forecourt
- Do not climb on any structures
- Do not throw objects off the dam wall or viewing platforms
- No model aircraft or drones
